











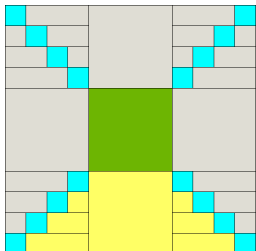
# Amprior Guild Mystery Quilt 2010/2011

## Clue Three

### Fabric Requirements:

**\*Note:** Read instructions before cutting fabric. You may have your own method of constructing these units and will need to adjust fabric cutting requirements accordingly.



### Chain Block

A variation of Single Irish Chain

You will need 4 Blocks

Unfinished Block = 12 1/2"

Finished (in quilt) = 12"

### Corner Units:

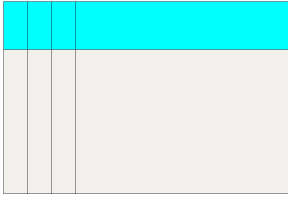
To make the corner units we will first build some strip sets (or strata) and then cross cut the strip sets to get the required number of units. Starching your fabric is helpful to keep the strip sets straight. I recommend using a walking foot while building your strip sets. If your fabric is not 40" wide, you can substitute 2 shorter strip sets.

### Strip Set A:

1 1/2" high X 4 1/2" long

Total required = 24



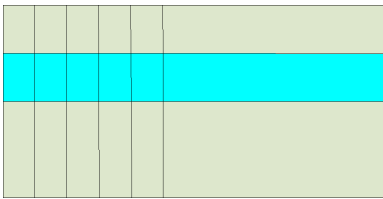


Cut one strip of Accent B fabric 1 1/2" wide X 40 inches long.  
 Cut one strip Background B fabric 3 1/2" wide X 40 inches long.  
 Sew long sides together and press seam towards Accent B fabric.  
 Strip set will measure 4 1/2" X 40".  
 Square up one end of the strip set and cross cut 24 sections 1 1/2" wide.

**Note:** When you are cross cutting across a seam, your ruler rocks slightly and you may be starting to cut on a slight angle. This is hardly noticeable at first but becomes greater as you make more crosscuts. To keep everything square, double check after every 3 or 4 crosscuts and square up the edge if necessary. If your strip set is about 40" long you will have enough fabric to realign frequently.

**Strip Set B:**  
 1 1/2" X 4 1/2"

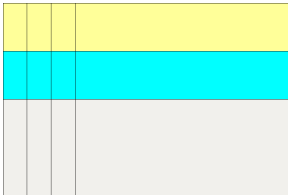
**Total Required = 16**



Cut one strip Accent B Fabric 1 1/2" wide X 26" long.  
 Cut one strip Background B fabric 1 1/2" wide X 26" long.  
 Cut one strip Background B fabric 2 1/2" wide X 26" long.  
 Sew strips together as per diagram.  
 Strip set will measure 4 1/2" X 26".  
 Square up one end of strip set and cross cut 16 sections 1 1/2" wide.  
 Refer to Note on cross cutting below strip set A.

**Strip Set C:**  
 1 1/2" X 4 1/2"

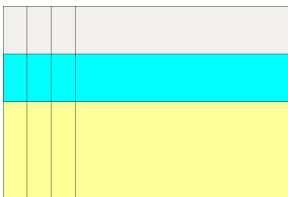
**Total Required = 8**



Cut one strip Accent B fabric 1 1/2" wide X 14" long.  
 Cut one strip Background A fabric 1 1/2" wide X 14" long.  
 Cut one strip Background B fabric 2 1/2" wide X 14" long.  
 Sew strips together as per diagram.  
 Strip set will measure 4 1/2" X 14" long.  
 Square up one end of strip set and cross cut 8 section 1 1/2" wide.  
 Refer to Note on cross cutting below strip set A.

**Strip Set D:**  
 1 1/2" X 4 1/2"

**Total Required = 8**

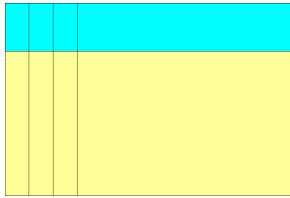
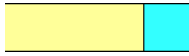


Cut one strip Accent B fabric 1 1/2" wide X 14" long.  
 Cut one strip Background A fabric 2 1/2" wide X 14" long.  
 Cut one strip Background B fabric 1 1/2" wide X 14" long.  
 Sew strips together as per diagram.  
 Strip set will measure 4 1/2" X 14" long.  
 Square up one end of strip set and cross cut 8 section 1 1/2" wide.  
 Refer to Note on cross cutting below strip set A.

**Strip Set E:**

**1 1/2" X 4 1/2"**

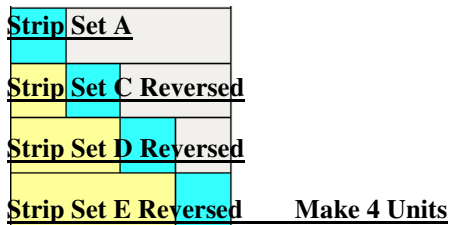
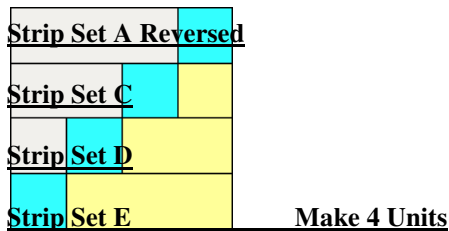
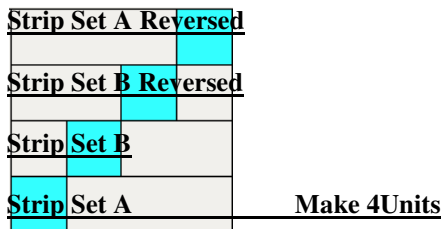
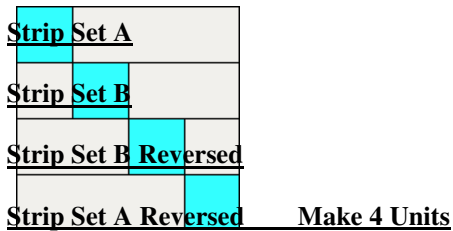
**Total Required = 8**



Cut one strip Accent B fabric 1 1/2" wide X 14" long.  
Cut one strip Background A fabric 3 1/2" wide X 14" long.  
Sew strips together as per diagram.  
Strip set will measure 4 1/2" X 14" long.  
Square up one end of strip set and cross cut 8 sections 1 1/2" wide.  
Refer to Note on cross cutting below strip set A.

**Assemble Corner Units:**

**Note: Strip Set A Reversed is Strip Set A flipped over so colours are in reversed positions. This is the same for all strip sets.**



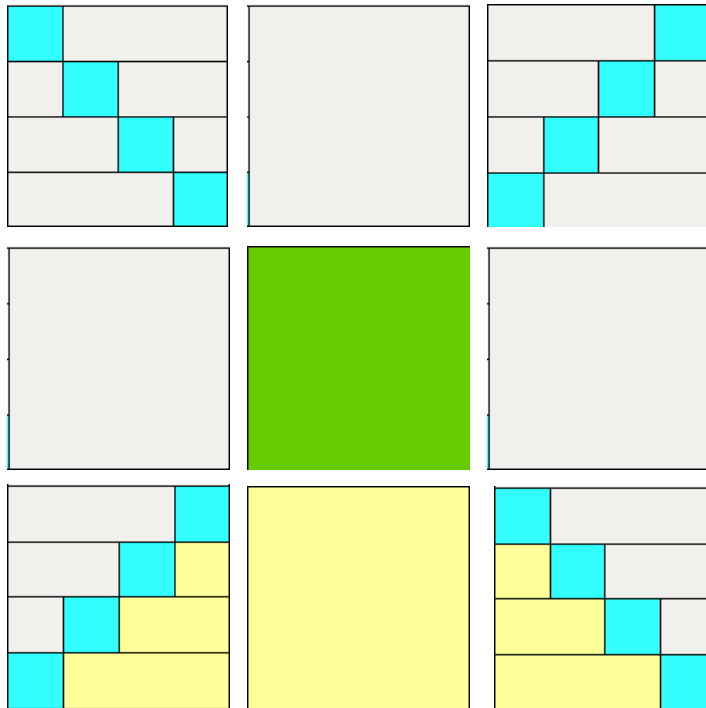
### Assemble Block

From Focus Fabric cut 4, 4 ½" squares.

From Background B cut 12, 4 ½" squares.

From Background A cut 4, 4 ½" squares.

Lay out units as per diagram.



Sew units together to create rows. Press top and bottom rows towards centre and centre rows towards the outside edges.

Sew rows together to complete block.

Make 4.

The next clue will be assembling the quilt top. See you then.
