
Programme



What's Happening

The following is what is happening from the Canadian Quilters Association:

- 1. Guild Umbrella Insurance Our guild umbrella insurance is 'up and running' and enrolled guilds will receive their certificates in the next couple of weeks. We know some guilds have insurance coverage in place, so we just want to assure you that guilds may enrol in the CQA/ACC insurance at any time during the year. Contact Jackie@canadianquilter.com
- 2. Lethbridge Is your guild making plans for a group to attend Quilt Canada in Lethbridge this year? It will be from June 4-6, 2015 and would be a great location for a guild *quilt retreat*. Your guild may be able to book rooms for a few days longer than the conference (University of Lethbridge offers 'hotel' rooms from May to September http://www.uleth.ca/conference/hotel) and add on your own special sewing days! - 3. Trend-Tex Challenge A fabric challenge is a great way to encourage quilters to stretch their skills in new directions! 
