This completes our participation in Quilt Canada's <u>Walk to Brock</u> guild challenge where the goal was to stitch from Mile Zero in Victoria to Brock University in St. Catharines, the home of Quilt Canada 2014 which took place in mid-June.

#### **Charity Projects by Mary DeVries**

I have enjoyed my term as Vice President very much. It has been very rewarding and the quilts which were donated to the various charities were greatly appreciated. All of the work done could not have been accomplished without the help and generosity of you the membership, many thanks to you.

This year the Charitable Program in the guild consisted of many parts. They were:


- **1. Quilts for the Phoenix Center of Renfrew County** 11 lap quilts were given to the "New Horizons" program for teens between the ages of 12-18 years who have mental health and/or behavioral issues.
- 2. Quilts for High River, Alberta 5 quilts were sent out to the flood victims in Alberta.
- **3. Meals on Wheels for Seniors** 24 placemats were given to the Arnprior Home support for the Seniors to enjoy while having their meals in December. 20 were also donated to the Seniors in Renfrew.
- **4. Family and Children's Services of Renfrew County** In December, 10 lap quilts were delivered to Pembroke for Foster Children.
- **5. Share a Gift Foundation** Members were asked to make Christmas stockings using a given pattern for children in the Arnprior/McNab/Braeside area . The stockings were filled by the parents of children in need.
- 6. Preemie quilts for the Rich Little Neo-Natal Unit of the Ottawa Civic Hospital

Over 100 have been made this year and more will be brought to the hospital since members can submit them up to the last meeting in June.

- **6. Dialysis Unit Renfrew Victoria Hospital** A queen sized basket quilt was made from the remaining blocks that members made in 2012-2013 and donated to RVH dialysis unit for a fund raiser.
- 7. Several quilts are in storage waiting for the need when it arises.

Seeing a smile on another's face when handing them a quilt is a blessing for both the giver and the receiver.

**Preemie Quilts** – Please consider setting aside a little time over the summer to make one or more of these little quilts which are donated to the Rich Little Special Care Unit at the Ottawa Hospital (Civic Campus) for distribution to premature newborns.
