REPORTS

Programme

The program committee has been very busy over the summer preparing activities and speakers for the 2014-2015 guild year. Speakers this year come from a wide variety of quilting styles – traditional to modern. Our September speaker is *Esther Bryan*, creator of The Quilt of Belonging. Once again we will highlight a guild member as our January show and tell.

The <u>Double Dutch challenge</u> was a huge success last year and is back by popular demand. Sign up will take place at the September meeting and instructions will be made available.

Fat Quarter Exchange will again be available to members.

Tinners is being replaced with two new activities – <u>Shoe Box Challenge</u>, where you bring a shoebox of scraps and an orphan block to the October guild meeting. The boxes will be exchanged. When you receive your exchanged box you will create a quilting project from the orphan block and scraps. You may add scraps from your own stash and ONE new fabric to bring the project together. The project may be totally finished (quilted and bound) or just the quilt top completed. Challenge is due for display at the Quilt Show in June 2015.

<u>Selvage Blitz</u> – It is always a good idea to cut off selvages from your fabric before you begin your project. Selvage is usually a different weave and sometimes colour. It can warp after washing and drying which may cause problems when using in a project. There are also at times little hole marks that become unsightly when used in a project. I like to keep my selvage with fabric info on it as a fabric reference – colour, fabric line, date of line. In this activity members will cut off their fabric selvages and bring them to guild. A basket will be available for dropping off. At the end of the year the selvages will be weighed and members will guess the weight. A prize will be for the member guessing the closest correct weight. Both Shoe Box Challenge and Selvage Blitz will start up in October.

Selvage — an edge produced on woven fabric during manufacturing that prevents it from unraveling. Reasons to remove the selvage: it is woven tighter and prone to pucker; after washing it can shrink and draw up; there may be small holes in the selvage that can show up when sewing; the selvage is often a different colour or shade than the fabric; the selvage may look straight but is not.

Workshop night in February was another huge success and will return for Feb 2015 meeting.

Yard Sale/Demo/Activity night will be in March.

Now is the time to begin thinking about joining the executive team for the 2015-2016 guild year. Elections and guild show registration will be at our May 2015 meeting.

We hope that this guild year will have a bit of something for everyone to participate in.


