Notes from the Vice-President



Welcome back Ladies to the 2016-2017 year for Arnprior and District Quilter's Guild. My role is to co-ordinate our charity projects. Last year we produced and donated 150+ preemie quilts to the Rich Little Neo-Natal Unit at the Civic Hospital in Ottawa. This year Jan Smith our treasurer did the actual delivery for our guild. We also produced and delivered 52 placemats for meals delivered by the Arnprior and Renfrew Meals on Wheels programs. The Christmas parcels from the Arnprior Food Bank included 200+ Christmas stockings made by our guild and stuffed with

toiletries by Arnprior CWL members. We also donated 15 small lap quilts to the Arnprior Seniors at Home group and the Sunshine Coach in Renfrew. Both groups transport seniors to medical appointments. Our lap quilts are provided to ensure the trips are more cozy and less draughty for the clients. Fort MacMurray, so tragically hit by fires that destroyed so many homes, had a quilt program to which we sent 2 large lap quilts. We waited until there was a secure centre established for the quilt storage and distribution, before mailing our quilts. We also provided a lap quilt to a person who was really sick, and we donated two quilts to The Arnprior Humane Society and The Rexall Pharmacy for raffle/silent donation purposes.

This year we plan to provide Christmas stockings to Arnprior again. The CWL contact person has already advised me that we need to provide 250 stockings this year. I handed out 50 at the June meeting and I would like to start gathering them as soon as you can bring them to our meetings. There are already 13 complete and 6 more in construction towards this years total.

Preemies are also in the plans: 24" square - all cotton or flannel construction. Batts will continue to be available at our meetings.

Christmas placemats are another repeat venture. These will be delivered by Meals on Wheels with the Christmas meal. I will check for the total number required once the Meals on Wheels programs can quote me numbers.

If anyone has suggestions for new projects we can be involved in please let me know. Our Guild continues to amaze me with our generosity when it comes to making items for those in need.

Challenges

We would like each one of our members to try one of our challenges this year. Then we will know that we have inspired you! Of course, you are very welcome to try several! All challenges will be brought back to the April meeting in time for the quilt show!

Crayon Challenge

You simply pick a crayon from the bag and you make a project made of that colour. You use only the one chosen colour for your quilt/project but you could also use different shades of that colour for contrast. Your project can be pieced or appliquéd, made into a quilt, runner, pillow, purse, etc. The only other rule is be creative!

Baby Block Quilt

Joyce will give you a piece of fabric, and you will be challenged to use it a baby quilt. This will be quilt that you can make to keep or to donate.

Monthly Activities

Block of the Month

Rennie Hickey and Vickie McNabb will be presenting a new block each month. Members bring in their finished blocks from the previous month, and put their name in a hat (one entry per block). The winning name drawn from the hat takes home all the blocks for that month. If there are a large number of blocks returned, two names can be drawn and they can be split between two people.



Blue represents the Madawaska and Ottawa rivers in Arnprior; gold, the sunshine and fields of corn around Arnprior; brown, the acres of farmland in the area; and green, Gillies Grove and surrounding forests and tree
