Notes from the Vice-President

We will have lots of opportunity to quilt for charity this year. So ladies, get your sewing machines ready for action!

New

- 1. Finishing Slab Block Quilts. Congratulations to all who made slab blocks for the Big Quilt Bee. 2,614 quilts were given to Ronald McDonald Houses across Canada for kids. Excellent job ladies! We have been given some leftover slab blocks to give to other charities. Since some were put together and are nearly finished, I have decided that the ones which are very Canadian, we will donate to Quilts of Valour and a couple will go to Victoria's Quilts. We will provide the batting, backing and are just looking for quilters for these quilts. Please help us.
- 2. Wheelchair lap quilts with Velcro straps to attach to chair arms would be gratefully received by the Grove Nursing Home in Arnprior. At Christmas, some residents who have no family, would receive these and to be used daily for their comfort. Some of the slab blocks can be used for this project and batting will be provided. Sizes will have finalized by the meeting. Minimum lap quilts required is 15.
- 3. **Bibs** for Day Programs are also needed by the Grove Nursing Home in Arnprior.
- Placemats to be distributed with the freezer meals given out in Fitzroy Harbour/Constance Bay by the Western Ottawa Community Resource Centre for Seniors. We will need 10 or 12 of these.

We will continue with

- Preemie Quilts for the Rich Little Special Care Nursery at the Ottawa Civic Campus. These are 24" x 24" square, all cotton or flannel construction, and batting is provided by the guild.
- Placemats for Meals on Wheels-Arnprior. We will require somewhere between 20-30 placemats. They will be delivered with the Christmas meal. Please make Christmas on one side of the placemat and the back an interesting pattern/fabric to be used the rest of the year.




