## **Program Notes**

#### January 23 Meeting - Learning Activity Night - Fabric Origami

For this meeting you will need to bring:

- basic sewing kit (scissors, pins, needles, thread)
- 6 1/2 inch square ruler
- marking pen
- thimble
- 2 or 3 prepared 8 1/2 inch circles

#### To prepare a circle:

- 1. Cut out 2 circles 8 1/2 inches in diameter of contrasting colours.
- 2. Matching contrasting colours (light to dark) and right sides together, sew pairs together by machine, maintaining even 1/4" seam allowance. Leave a 2" opening.
- 3. Fold both seams inward toward the center of the circle and press. Follow curved line to make a nice, rounded curve.
- 4. Turn right side out.
- 5. Blind stitch opening closed. Press to reinforce shape.
