DID YOU KNOW

Suggested Quilt Measurements for Standard Bed Sizes

This information is a guide to planning a quilt for a particular bed. Factors to consider are the mattress size, the mattress thickness, the amount of drop you desire, whether or not to include a pillow tuck, desired distance from the floor, and "take-up" caused by the quilting itself. These dimensions include a 15" drop on the sides and bottom of the quilt. No extra length is included for a pillow tuck. These sizes are designed for use with a dust ruffle. Quilting, if moderate to heavy, may reduce the finished size of your quilt by 1" to 3" or more and should be considered when planning the finished size of your quilt.

Twin quilt sizes (mattress size):

68" x 89" (39"x 76" mattress. Smallest mattress)

Twin X-Long quilt sizes (mattress size):

68" x 94" (39" x 80" mattress. College dorms)

Full/Double quilt size (mattress size):

84" x 89" (54" x 74" mattress. Shorter than Queen)

Queen quilt size (mattress size):

90" x 94" (60" x 80" mattress. Wider and longer than Full/Double)

King quilt size (mattress size):

106" x 94" (78" x 80" mattress. Largest size)

Cal-King quilt size (mattress size):

100" x 98" (72" x 84" mattress. Narrower and longer than King)

Mattress Depths:

Standard:7" to 9" Deep:10" to 15" Extra Deep:15" to 22"


